LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT

CASE offers facilitated certificate programs for employment practitioners to upskill and stay current on emerging practices, as well as brief, asynchronous (on your own time) courses for employers and employment practitioners.

CASE collaborates with diverse stakeholders to conduct and share research about the employment journeys of persons experiencing disability, including those with intersectional identities.



MENTORING MODEL

The CASE MentorAbility Canada initiative convenes a network of employment service providers and employers who leverage mentorships, networking and learning events, research and social media to promote inclusive workplaces.
